TODAY IN WORSHIP

Today we celebrate joyfully that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead! Our gathering and sending hymns proclaim "Jesus Christ Is Risen Today" and "Christ Is Risen! Shout Hosanna!"

During Lent, the somber and penitential season prior to Easter, we omit the word "Hallelujah" (or "Alleluia"). Now that Easter has arrived you will hear "Hallelujah" (Hebrew word) and "Alleluia" (Latin word), both words meaning "Praise the Lord," throughout the service (e.g. Act of Praise, Anthem, and Offertory). During the Act of Praise, the congregation joins the choir in singing the "Hallelujah Chorus" from G.F. Handel's *Messiah*. While often performed during the Christmas Season, Handel originally conceived *Messiah* as an Easter offering. There is a tradition of people standing during the singing of the "Hallelujah Chorus." Supposedly King George II was so moved by the London premiere of this work that he stood during the "Hallelujah Chorus" and everyone else followed his lead. The Alleluia Choir (age 3-VPK) begins their anthem by singing "Hallelu" (meaning "let us praise" or "praise"), then adds "Yah" ("the Lord"), so that together they sing "Hallelujah" (meaning "Praise ye the Lord"). Jake Runestad (born 1986) composed the offertory piece, "Alleluia." The following is what he said about this piece: "Through history, the singing of "alleluia" has served as an outward celebration as well as an introspective expression of praise. The work begins with a rhythmic declaration of joy and builds intensity through metric changes, tonal shifts, glissandi, and hand clapping. This lively exultation soon gives way to a reverent meditation with soaring melodic lines and lush harmonies. The dancing rhythms from the beginning return with a gradual build in intensity as one's praises rise to the sky."

Our three prelude pieces celebrate Christ's triumphant victory in different ways. "Praise the Lord," by Sigfrid Karg-Elert (1877-1933), is a joyful instrumental piece played today by the Gainesville Brass Quintet. "The Trumpets Sound, the Angels Sing" was published in 1989 as a hymn by Graham Kendrick, and later arranged with percussion, brass, and steel drum accompaniment by Robert Hobby. This gathering song is filled with joy and includes images of Holy Communion, which we will take following the Offering and Doxology. "Sing Ye to the Lord" is an Easter anthem by Sir Edward Bairstow (1874-1946) that draws on a poetic interpretation by Robert Campbell (1814-1868) of Exodus 15:21b, 4a.

As we move through our Easter worship, the music conveys praise to God in different ways. In "The Trumpets Sound, the Angels Sing," we hear the sound of the steel drum, an instrument developed in the 1900s in Trinidad and Tobago. The "Hallelujah Chorus," featuring singers, trumpets, timpani, and organ, is a Baroque piece from the 1741 that is performed all over the world. "Alleluia" was composed in this century (2013) by Jake Runestad, who was 26 or 27 years old at the time. Finally, our sending hymn "Christ Is Risen! Shout Hosanna!" and postlude "Joyful, Joyful" are based on Ludwig van Beethoven's tune "Ode to Joy" from his 9th Symphony. Although set in different styles, they are both joyful exclamations of worship. The sending hymn features congregation, brass, percussion, and organ, and the postlude features soloists, choir, percussion, and piano. The postlude, from "Sister Act 2," is set in a gospel style by Mervyn Warren and Roger Emerson and seems to lend itself to clapping at the end. When the choir starts clapping, you are welcome to join, fitting with Psalm 47:1 "Clap your hands, all you peoples; shout to God with loud songs of joy." Whether its 3 year-olds leading us in the anthem, or people of all ages in the congregation singing the hymns, we invite you today to offer praise and glory to the God who sacrificed himself for us, crucified, and now risen.

It seems likely that this beloved Easter text began in Latin and moved through German before reaching English, where it combined with the present tune in the emerging English evangelical style, a reaction to the restrained one-note-per-syllable psalmody that preceded it.
