

This text is so familiar that it is easy to miss all its paradox, mystery, suffering, and beauty; it rewards careful reading and meditation outside corporate worship. The tune's composer, chapel organist at Windsor Castle, had much experience in creating a royal sound.

^{5b}'Stand up and bless the LORD your God from everlasting to everlasting. Blessed be Your glorious name, which is exalted above all blessing and praise.' 6And Ezra said: 'You are the LORD, You alone; You have made heaven, the heaven of heavens, with all their host, the earth and all that is on it, the seas and all that is in them. "And You saw the distress of our ancestors in Egypt and heard their cry at the Red Sea. ¹⁰You performed signs and wonders against Pharaoh and all his servants and all the people of his land, for You knew that they acted insolently against our ancestors. You made a name for Yourself, which remains to this day. ¹¹And You divided the sea before them, so that they passed through the sea on dry land, but You threw their pursuers into the depths, like a stone into mighty waters. ¹²Moreover, You led them by day with a pillar of cloud, and by night with a pillar of fire, to give them light on the way in which they should go. ¹³You came down also upon Mount Sinai, and spoke with them from heaven, and gave them right ordinances and true laws, good statutes and commandments, 14 and You made known Your holy sabbath to them and gave them commandments and statutes and a law through Your servant Moses. ¹⁵For their hunger You gave them bread from heaven, and for their thirst You brought water for them out of the rock, and You told them to go in to possess the land that You swore to give them.
