God of Compassion, in Mercy 436 Befriend Us



By ending with questions rather than simple affirmations, this text conveys a strong sense of faith in God's presence and guidance without ignoring how much of the future remains unknown. The confidence of the text is well matched by its sturdy 17th-century French tune.

⁵⁴When they heard these things, they became enraged and ground their teeth at Stephen. ⁵⁵But filled with the Holy Spirit, he gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. ⁵⁶"Look," he said, "I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!" ⁵⁷But they covered their ears, and with a loud shout all rushed together against him. ⁵⁸Then they dragged him out of the city and began to stone him; and the witnesses laid their coats at the feet of a young man named Saul. ⁵⁹While they were stoning Stephen, he prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." ⁶⁰Then he knelt down and cried out in a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." When he had said this, he died.

¹And Saul approved of their killing him. That day a severe persecution began against the church in Jerusalem, and all except the apostles were scattered throughout the countryside of Judea and Samaria. ²Devout men buried Stephen and made loud lamentation over him. ³But Saul was ravaging the church by entering house after house; dragging off both men and women, he committed them to prison.

OLD TESTAMENT READING

Esther 4 (NRSV)

¹When Mordecai learned all that had been done, Mordecai tore his clothes and put on sackcloth and ashes, and went through the city, wailing with a loud and bitter cry; ²he went up to the entrance of the king's gate, for no one might enter the king's gate clothed with sackcloth. ³In every province, wherever the king's command and his decree came, there was great mourning among the Jews, with fasting and weeping and lamenting, and most of them lay in sackcloth and ashes. ⁴When Esther's maids and her eunuchs came and told her, the queen was deeply distressed; she sent garments to clothe Mordecai, so that he might take off his sackcloth; but he would not accept them.

⁵Then Esther called for Hathach, one of the king's eunuchs, who had been appointed to attend her, and ordered him to go to Mordecai to learn what was happening and why. 6Hathach went out to Mordecai in the open square of the city in front of the king's gate, ⁷ and Mordecai told him all that had happened to him, and the exact sum of money that Haman had promised to pay into the king's treasuries for the destruction of the Jews. 8Mordecai also gave him a copy of the written decree issued in Susa for their destruction, that he might show it to Esther, explain it to her, and charge her to go to the king to make supplication to him and entreat him for her people. Hathach went and told Esther what Mordecai had said. ¹⁰Then Esther spoke to Hathach and gave him a message for Mordecai, saying, 11" All the king's servants and the people of the king's provinces know that if any man or woman goes to the king inside the inner court without being called, there is but one law — all alike are to be put to death. Only if the king holds out the golden scepter to someone, may that person live. I myself have not been called to come in to the king for thirty days." ¹²When they told Mordecai what Esther had said, ¹³Mordecai told them to reply to Esther, "Do not think that in the king's palace you will escape any more than all the other Jews. 14For if you keep silence at such a time as this, relief and deliverance will rise for the Jews from another quarter, but you and your father's family will perish. Who knows? Perhaps you have come to royal dignity for just such a time as this." ¹⁵Then Esther said in reply to Mordecai, ¹⁶"Go, gather all the Jews to be found in Susa, and hold a fast on my behalf, and neither eat nor drink for three days, night or day. I and my maids will also fast as you do. After that I will go to the king, though it is against the law; and if I perish, I perish." ¹⁷Mordecai then went away and did everything as Esther had ordered him


FOCUS ON STEWARDSHIP

During Stewardship Emphasis, I am always reminded of this true story: Outside of a church in Germany before World War II, there stood a beautiful statue of our Lord with His hands outstretched in a beseeching invitation, "Come to me all you who labor and are heavy burdened and I will give you rest"!! The area was then subjected to heavy bombing and the hands of Jesus were broken off at the wrists! After the war, the members of the congregation began to think about reconstruction. Their first desire was to replace the hands of Christ ... but then after more careful consideration, they decided to leave the handless statue just as it was!! Said they, "We shall be His hands. WE SHALL BE HIS HANDS!!!"

In a very real sense, our Lord has no hands but ours to accomplish His purposes in this world!! He has no feet but ours to go on His errands of mercy and practical service. He has no voice but ours to speak out for goodness and truth!! Jesus calls us to give a cup of cold water to the thirsty, to feed the hungry, to welcome strangers, to clothe the poor, to care for the homeless, and to minister to the sick. He said, "In as much as you have done it to one of the least of these … you have done it to Me"!! … a kind word, a listening ear, a small act of caring … all done in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!!

And so, let's give ourselves anew to what lies before us ... a life of service ... always praying for God's guidance and life giving Spirit!! The need is great!! Let us each make a generous pledge, a commitment of our time, our talents, and our financial resources, to support the work of our church, part of the Body of Christ. Freely we have received, freely let us give!


