## **UNDERSTANDING OUR CHURCH'S FINANCES**

Hello First Presbyterian Church Family,

I have a unique task. I need to report on a meeting that hasn't happened yet. Well, it hasn't when I'm writing, but I think it will have happened by the time you read this. You see, on Sunday, April 27, we will have a congregational meeting for the purpose of hearing a report from our Trustees and our Budget and Finance Committee. In the meeting, our presenters will give us an overview of our church's finances. I'm going to try to talk about what they are going to say, before they even say it. I know that's a tall task.

Our presenters will explain that we have approximately \$1,837,279 in our savings/investment accounts. These are monies that have been donated and saved over the years. They are divided between unrestricted funds (~ \$595,526) and dedicated funds (~ \$1,241,753). The restricted funds were given for a specific ministry or purpose, the unrestricted funds were given to be used as the church thought best. When it comes to our finances, we are probably better off than a lot of churches, but we have a particular challenge facing us. For several years, even a long time prior to my arrival, we have been running a budget deficit that probably averages about \$153,708 per year. At this point, we have been paying off that deficit with unrestricted funds.

The problem is, we could be at a point where we no longer have unrestricted funds in five to ten years, maybe even sooner depending on how things go. What will happen when our treasurer says to our trustees, "We need money to make payroll (or for repairs to the church) and the unrestricted funds are exhausted"?

First, we want to make you aware of this challenge. Next, we want to be in conversation with you about opportunities and possibilities. Then, we want to be implementing several new strategies. It probably won't be one approach; it will be several. Attracting new members and raising funds will likely be part of our strategy, but it will probably take more than just that.

In the five years I've been here, this conversation has been going on almost constantly in Trustee and Budget & Finance Meetings. Session is also aware. It's time to have this conversation more openly, where all of us can understand what's at stake and be involved in the solution. We, as a congregation, need to take steps to ensure the spiritual and financial health of our church for years to come. Please be in prayer about this. Be in conversation with your elders, trustees, and others that volunteer in financial areas with our church. This is a time to come together. To hope, believe, be active, and see what God wants to do in our midst as we trust him and come together to work towards a goal. If you have any questions, don't hesitate to contact me.
