TODAY, WE BEGIN A NEW SERMON SERIES, "LIVE IN JUSTNESS, NOT IN JUDGMENT." While the second reading will change, the first Scriptural reading each Sunday of this series will be Micah 6:6-8. The second reading this week is 1 Thessalonians 5:12-24. Our gathering hymn, "When Morning Gilds the Skies," relates to verses 16-18. The sending hymn, "God Be with You Till We Meet Again," was chosen for its connection to 1 Thessalonians 5:23-24, and because this hymn is from the SENDING section of our *Glory to God* hymnal.

On this day, we dedicate the 41 children and adults headed to Montreat, NC on June 20 for the 2026 Worship & Music Conference. As these participants create music, learn, and worship, they will be guided by this year's theme, "Who'll be a witness for my Lord?" As the conference co-directors indicate, "This conference will invite us to consider our collective call to be faithful witnesses to the crucified and risen Lord, no matter the circumstances that shape our common life together."

We thank Dr. Russell Robinson for leading the choir in the anthem this morning. The Summer Choir is singing an arrangement of "Amazing Grace" that Dr. Robinson published in 2026. Dr. Russell Robinson, Emeritus Professor Music Education at the University of Florida, has made over 300 appearances as a conductor, speaker, consultant, and presenter at festivals, workshops, honor choirs, all-state choirs and state, regional, national, and international conferences in the U.S., Europe, Asia, Africa, Central America, South America, Mexico, Canada, the Middle East, and Australia.

Our prelude and offertory are sung by Delaney Geiser. Delaney is a First Presbyterian Church Choral Scholar, as well as voice major at the University of Florida. We are thankful for her musical leadership this morning. Her prelude solo, "Great Is Thy Faithfulness," connects with 1 Thessalonians 5:24 and the offertory, "A Gaelic Blessing," relates to the idea of peace in 1 Thessalonians 5:13b.

Thank you for joining us in worship today. We pray that you experience Christ's presence in our midst and that His presence will sustain you in the week ahead. Visitors are welcome to participate in the worship and the work of First Presbyterian Church. This is not just a morning hymn, though this excerpt from an English translation of an early 19th-century German text may not convey how thoroughly the original deals with different kinds of time throughout the day. The tune was composed as a setting for this English text.

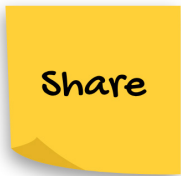
