Hello First Presbyterian Church Family,

Because of my job, I am always talking to people that are in crisis. They are or a family member is sick, a relative or a friend made a big mistake and the repercussions from it are horrible, or someone dear to them just passed. I'm not complaining about my job. In fact, it is the honor of my life to be called into the worst situations you and your family will ever experience. But during these moments I often hear, or see in your eyes, "It's not supposed to be like this! This isn't supposed to happen."

Your feeling that it isn't supposed to be like this in those moments, moments of tremendous loss or challenge, is spot on. It's not; yet it often is. These types of experiences are one of the ways we connect with our sense of longing. We do this in the season of Advent, as we move toward the coming of our true king, Jesus. We connect with the longing that the people of Israel had as they waited for their king.

Advent begins on November 30 and ends at our

service on Christmas Eve. It is a time when we connect with the feelings of the ancient God-fearers as they longed for Jesus, their Messiah, to come to earth. We connect with their sense of longing as we wait for Jesus to come again, as we continue to experience things that we shouldn't have to experience. It is a time when we challenge the sense that says we are missing something, and have hope and trust in the One who is to come. During Advent this year, let's push into that dark place, believing that the light has come, and it will come again! And because of that, we can be people of hope, no matter what surrounds us.

AND, if you do not know where would be best for you, please reach out to me so I can help you find a group where you can grow together.

#### YOUTH:

If you are in **Middle or High School**, I invite you to join us on Wednesday nights from 4:15-5:00 p.m. in the Youth Room (Room # 211) as we study the Gospel of John and find out what this OG, first century, Gen 1 follower of Christ has to say about his time with The Messiah through his eyes and Jesus' own words.

If you are in **High School**, please join us -when we meet- on Sundays after church for Youth Connection from 12:30-2:30 p.m. in the Youth Room (Room # 211). We are working through the book, *Can I Ask That: Volume 2: More Hard Questions About God & Faith.* We start by eating lunch together, then have time together in God's word and play a game.

#### **COLLEGE:**

If you are in **college** we would love to have you join us on Tuesdays starting at 7:00 p.m. in Gordon Hall as different teachers lead us through the truths from God's word and how they impact and should be applied to our lives. Our hope is that while you are

growing academically here in Gainesville, you will also grow in your Christian faith by spending time in the Bible and with others who are doing the same.

#### **YOUNG ADULT AND FAMILY MINISTRY:**

As with the group above, we are aware that personal and professional schedules are always changing, so our meeting day changes each month to allow for the most people possible to make the meeting. Regardless of the date, our normal meeting time is from around 7:00/7:30 p.m - 9:00 p.m. at McAlister's Deli on Newberry Road. (For this group, we know that you are just getting started in life, so the church covers the cost of your meal!)

#### **SUNDAY MORNINGS:**

Gordon Hoover – This is perhaps the longest continual Bible Study group in the loonnngggg history of First Pres and continues to focus on a book-by-book study of the Bible. Through a team of teachers, they take their time working through each book of the Bible in a way that leads to knowing more about the Word of God and the God of His word.

Multiply Class – I invite you to join this group which focuses on books of the Bible one chapter at a time, allowing the time the class needs to learn and discuss in hopes they go and do. This year they have focused on 1 Samuel and are ending the year focusing on the Gospel of Luke before continuing on to the book of Acts. 

**The Senior Saints** are meeting monthly on and off campus for fellowship and fun.


**LOGOS** is bursting at the seams with children, youth, and families every Wednesday! They spend time in worship, recreation, study, and family dinners.

# ONTREAT For more than thirty-five

years children, youth, and adults from First Presbyterian Church have attended the Presbyterian Association of Musicians annual worship and music conference in Montreat, North Carolina. The week-long conference begins with a worship service on Sunday evening for the 1,000 conferees from Presbyterian Churches nationwide. Daily classes begin on Monday and are designed to enrich understanding and develop skills in the corporate worship of the church. Each conferee attends worship, choir, Bible, handbells, Orff, dance, and/or an elective course each day. The impact of this week at Montreat is far greater than the knowledge gained at the conference. The benefits of living, worshiping, praying, and playing together in community for a week are life-changing.

Each conferee pays approximately \$400 for conference registration and \$95 for food. In addition, each conferee is responsible for their "fairshare" of \$150 for housing and transportation. The children earn their fairshare by participating in fundraising events held throughout the year. This year, our church budget allocates \$10,000 towards the cost of housing and transportation. This year our goal for fundraising for Montreat housing and transportation expenses is \$24,000.
