THIS SUNDAY is Dedication Sunday, and we conclude the Haggai Sermon Series. As we submit our pledge cards, the prelude (*Jesus' Hands Were Kind Hands*), gathering hymn (*We Praise You, O God*), and Anthem (*Take My Life*) speak to stewarding our time, abilities, and possessions. The sending hymn, as well as postlude, is the hymn *I Want to Walk as a Child of the Light*. Taken from the A NEW HEAVEN AND A NEW EARTH section of *Glory to God*, this hymn speaks to Haggai 2:20-23, the Future Hope of God's Kingdom, the new Jerusalem. Please check out bibleproject.com, for a summary of the book of Haggai.

The offertory is a new composition from Janine Alexander (First Presbyterian Church congregant and songwriter) and Jane Kozhevnikova (PhD candidate in composition, University of Florida). It was Janine's request that this piece be sung during the Easter Season. Following the liturgical year, May 18, 2025 is the Fifth Sunday of Easter.

Our prelude composer is Sue Ellen Page, past director of choirs for children and youth at Nassau Presbyterian Church, Princeton, and founder of the Trenton Children's Chorus. Philip Lawson, GRAMMY winner and composer of *Take My Life*, was a member of the King's Singers for many years. The postlude arrangement was composed by Wayne Wold, professor at Hood College from 1990 to 2020, as well as director of chapel music at Camp David for seventeen years.

Thank you for joining us in worship today. We pray that you experience Christ's presence in our midst and that His presence will sustain you in the week ahead. Visitors are welcome to participate in the worship and the work of First Presbyterian Church. 
