#### NEW TESTAMENT READING

<sup>21</sup>Now after these things had been accomplished, Paul resolved in the Spirit to go through Macedonia and Achaia, and then to go on to Jerusalem. He said, "After I have gone there, I must also see Rome." <sup>22</sup>So he sent two of his helpers, Timothy and Erastus, to Macedonia, while he himself stayed for some time longer in Asia. <sup>23</sup>About that time no little disturbance broke out concerning the Way. <sup>24</sup>A man named Demetrius, a silversmith who made silver shrines of Artemis, brought no little business to the artisans. <sup>25</sup>These he gathered together, with the workers of the same trade, and said, "Men, you know that we get our wealth from this business. <sup>26</sup>You also see and hear that not only in Ephesus but in almost the whole of Asia this Paul has persuaded and drawn away a considerable number of people by saying that gods made with hands are not gods. <sup>27</sup>And there is danger not only that this trade of ours may come into disrepute but also that the temple of the great goddess Artemis will be scorned, and she will be deprived of her majesty that brought all Asia and the world to worship her." <sup>28</sup>When they heard this, they were enraged and shouted, "Great is Artemis of the Ephesians!" <sup>29</sup>The city was filled with the confusion; and people rushed together to the theater, dragging with them Gaius and Aristarchus, Macedonians who were Paul's travel companions. <sup>30</sup>Paul wished to go into the crowd, but the disciples would not let him; <sup>31</sup>even some officials of the province of Asia, who were friendly to him, sent him a message urging him not to venture into the theater. <sup>32</sup>Meanwhile, some were shouting one thing, some another; for the assembly was in confusion, and most of them did not know why they had come together. <sup>33</sup>Some of the crowd gave instructions to Alexander, whom the Jews had pushed forward. And Alexander motioned for silence and tried to make a defense before the people. <sup>34</sup>But when they recognized that he was a Jew, for about two hours all of them shouted in unison, "Great is Artemis of the Ephesians!" <sup>35</sup>But when the town clerk had quieted the crowd, he said, "Citizens of Ephesus, who is there that does not know that the city of the Ephesians is the temple keeper of the great Artemis and of the statue that fell from heaven? <sup>36</sup>Since these things cannot be denied, you ought to be quiet and do nothing rash. <sup>37</sup>You have brought these men here who are neither temple robbers nor blasphemers of our goddess. <sup>38</sup>If therefore Demetrius and the artisans with him have a complaint against anyone, the courts are open, and there are proconsuls; let them bring charges there against one another. <sup>39</sup>If there is anything further you want to know, it must be settled in the regular assembly. <sup>40</sup>For we are in danger of being charged with rioting today, since there is no cause that we can give to justify this commotion." <sup>41</sup>When he had said this, he dismissed the assembly.

#### OLD TESTAMENT READING

<sup>1</sup>This happened in the days of Ahasuerus, the same Ahasuerus who ruled over one hundred twenty-seven provinces from India to Ethiopia. <sup>2</sup>In those days when King Ahasuerus sat on his royal throne in the citadel of Susa, <sup>3</sup>in the third year of his reign, he gave a banquet for all his officials and ministers. The army of Persia and Media and the nobles and governors of the provinces were present, <sup>4</sup>while he displayed the great wealth of his kingdom and the splendor and pomp of his majesty for many days, one hundred eighty days in all. <sup>5</sup>When these days were completed, the king gave for all the people present in the citadel of Susa, both great and small, a banquet lasting for seven days, in the court of the garden of the king's palace. <sup>6</sup>There were white cotton curtains and blue hangings tied with cords of fine linen and purple to silver rings and marble pillars. There were couches of gold and silver on a mosaic pavement of porphyry, marble, mother-of-pearl, and colored stones. <sup>7</sup>Drinks were served in golden goblets, goblets of different kinds, and the royal wine was lavished according to the bounty of the king. <sup>8</sup>Drinking was by flagons, without restraint; for the king had given orders to all the officials of his palace to do as each one desired. <sup>9</sup>Furthermore, Queen Vashti gave a banquet for the women in the palace of King Ahasuerus.

<sup>10</sup>On the seventh day, when the king was merry with wine, he commanded Mehuman, Biztha, Harbona, Bigtha and Abagtha, Zethar and Carkas, the seven eunuchs who attended him, <sup>11</sup>to bring Queen Vashti before the king, wearing the royal crown, in order to show the peoples and the officials her beauty; for she was fair to behold.<sup>12</sup>But Queen Vashti refused to come at the king's command conveyed by the eunuchs. At this the king was enraged, and his anger burned within him. <sup>13</sup>Then the king consulted the sages who knew the laws (for this was the king's procedure toward all who were versed in law and custom, <sup>14</sup>and those next to him were Carshena, Shethar, Admatha, Tarshish, Meres, Marsena, and Memucan, the seven officials of Persia and Media, who had access to the king, and sat first in the kingdom): <sup>15</sup>"According to the law, what is to be done to Queen Vashti because she has not performed the command of King Ahasuerus conveyed by the eunuchs?" <sup>16</sup>Then Memucan said in the presence of the king and the officials, "Not only has Queen Vashti done wrong to the king, but also to all the officials and all the peoples who are in all the provinces of King Ahasuerus.<sup>17</sup>For this deed of the queen will be made known to all women, causing them to look with contempt on their husbands, since they will say, 'King Ahasuerus commanded Queen Vashti to be brought before him, and she did not come.' <sup>18</sup>This very day the noble ladies of Persia and Media who have heard of the queen's behavior will rebel against the king's officials, and there will be no end of contempt and wrath! <sup>19</sup>If it pleases the king, let a royal order go out from him, and let it be written among the laws of the Persians and the Medes so that it may not be altered, that Vashti is never again to come before King Ahasuerus; and let the king give her royal position to another who is better than she. <sup>20</sup>So when the decree made by the king is proclaimed throughout all his kingdom, vast as it is, all women will give honor to their husbands, high and low alike."<sup>21</sup>This advice pleased the king and the officials, and the king did as Memucan proposed; <sup>22</sup>he sent letters to all the royal provinces, to every province in its own script and to every people in its own language, declaring that every man should be master in his own house.


# FOCUS ON STEWARDSHIP
