

THE FLOWERS IN WORSHIP are given to the glory of God and in honor of Cretora Biggerstaff from family.

Today's Scripture and Sermon focus on Prayer. Our gathering hymn, "What a Friend We Have in Jesus," and hymn of the day, "Shepherd Me, O God," are from the PRAYER section of the *Glory to God* Hymnal (Hymns 464-474). The sending hymn, "Let All Things Now Living," connects with Colossians 4:2, one of our scriptural verses for today.

Our anthem, "Baba Yetu" is a Swahili-language setting of "The Lord's Prayer." This choral setting by Christopher Tin became the title song for the video game "Civilization IV" and was the first piece of video game music to be nominated for (and win) a Grammy Award.

The prelude, offertory, and postlude come from Heather Sorenson's "The Prayer Project." Below is the forward to her book: "I cry when I pray; God is listening to me. And so, when I was approached about doing a project on prayer, I immediately said, "yes." I'm not sure what my publisher had in mind when this album/book was first proposed, but I knew this was probably not going to be a "warm, fuzzy" project. I knew I was going to have to go deep. "So Be It" was especially difficult to write, as I was struggling at that time to reconcile my circumstances to the words that God was prompting me to write. When God wants me to pay special attention to what He is trying to tell me, He usually asks me to write a song about it. Funny how that works! I can look back on my repertoire and see lessons learned, tests I've yet to pass, and intense conversations with God.

As I immersed myself in The Prayer Project (we called it that for so long in production, that it eventually just became the official name), I struggled with prayer. It wasn't so much that I struggled with the act of praying - I struggled with the mystery of prayer. The summary of prayer goes beyond simply asking and receiving. Sometimes, we don't get what we expected, and at times, our prayers are met with seeming silence. Studying the broader scope of prayer in Scripture gives us a more complete picture; and yet still, there remains a mystery to prayer. You can find more of my thoughts on this topic in the downloadable content that goes with this book.

During my work on The Prayer Project, I carried some of my heaviest requests to God, and I wrestled deeply with this mystery of prayer. At the end of the project, my conclusion brought me back full circle to the first sentence of this foreword: "God is listening." Prayer is about the relationship. It's how I "draw near to God." He wants me to come to Him continually as I live my life. And, like a good Father, His response is always based on His love for me.


